

About Our Support and Information Line

This support line is available to anyone who has been affected by any form of sexual assault and sexual abuse. Volunteers work evening and weekend shifts to provide emotional support, information, crisis intervention, grounding, advocacy and referrals.

Phone, Text & Chat Support Volunteer Responsibilities:

- Provide crisis intervention, short term support, information, assessment, advocacy and referrals over the phone, as well as via text and chat to individuals affected by all forms of sexual violence.
- Maintain confidentiality
- Interact with callers, volunteers and staff in a respectful and empowering manner

Volunteer Training

All of our volunteers receive more than 45 hours of training in order to provide the specific support that individuals from our communities need. We want all of our volunteers to feel confident and comfortable when supporting those we serve.

Training sessions introduce volunteers to CCASA's philosophies and services, and give insight into the ways in which people can make a difference in their communities.
