Children & Youth Programs

We offer education and training opportunities for children, youth, caregivers or professionals working with children and youth.

"Who Do You Tell?"™

- A child sexual abuse education and safety program for elementary school aged children, their parents, and teachers. (Ages 5-12)

Birch Grove

- A youth education program that addresses the roots of sexual violence and planting seeds of change. Youth learn about various forms of sexual violence and examine the attitudes and beliefs that are at the root of it. (Ages 13-18)

Training sessions introduce volunteers to CCASA's philosophies and services, and give insight into the ways in which people can make a difference in their communities.

Facilitated Discussions

CCASA's Education & Training team also welcomes the opportunity to lead facilitated conversations on several topics related to sexual violence. These are often customized and tailored to your needs, and typically require a 2 - 3 hour time slot.
